Minutes

The regular monthly meeting of the Street Commission was called to order at 7:30 PM by Chairman Lester Ruben with a quorum present, as follows: Tom Callahan, Jean Dotson, Jack Roberts. Absent: Irene Saelens.

The minutes of the May 22, 1985 meeting were read and approved as read.

There was no correspondence.

OLD BUSINESS

It was reported that Council approved the Commission's recommendation to apply for a Special City Allotment Program grant to pave Driftwood Lane and the application has been mailed to Salem.

It was also reported that the matter of the vehicle standing on the Third Street right-of-way is in progress.

NEW BUSINESS

Culverts and ditch lines

Lester Ruben commented that while culverts and culvert permits are now being required of new home builders, there are instances where existing houses on the same street do not have driveway culverts. He did not see this as an immediate problem but suggested it is something that will need to be attended to as more lots are developed. It was agreed that when the City acquires a backhoe, a survey and rehabilitation of drainage ditches might be an appropriate project.

Vision obscurin brush at intersections

It was reported that complaints have been received regarding vision-obscuring tall grass and brush at the northwest corners of 3rd Street and Highway 101 and 4th Street and Highway 101. It was agreed to ask Public Works Superintendent John Mongelli to call this to the attention of the State Highway Division.

Quiet Water replat

A report was made of a recent Planning Commission discussion regarding the private access road which is part of the Village Center re-plat of the Quiet Water subdivision. Since it is a private road there is some question as to the Street Commission's jurisdiction. However, by consensus, the Commission stated their support of the Planning Commission's position regarding the road width, allowance for parking, and adequate drainage facilities.

There being no further business coming before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
